**On behalf of** the Ridley Scholarship Program's Board of Directors, it is my pleasure to present the Ridley Scholarship Program's 2022 Annual Report. This year's report comes to you at a momentous and exciting time in Ridley's history, as 2022 marks the 35th anniversary of the program.

What began as a scholarship fund created by Black alumni to provide small book awards for Black students is now a full-fledged merit-based program attracting exceptionally talented students to the University, supporting over 300 Black scholars throughout the years. For the 2021-22 academic year, the program had 17 Ridley Scholars on Grounds, the majority of whom received two- or four-year scholarships covering full tuition and fees. Our scholars excelled academically and made valuable, transformative contributions to the University community through their leadership and engagement in various student organizations.

Although Ridley has accomplished so much over the past 35 years, with our corpus growing to \$19.6 million, we still have more work to do to ensure that the Program is the premier Black scholarship organization in the nation. Additional donations as well as fund growth will enable us to support more Ridley Scholars and elevate the Ridley Scholar experience.

The Ridley Scholarship Program would not be the organization it is today without your dedication and generosity. Thank you for believing in Ridley's mission to build a community of learning, leadership and legacy for Black students at the University of Virginia.

Letter from the 2021-22 Scholarship Committee Chair

Our 35th year continues to be an exciting time for the Ridley Scholarship Program. We welcomed five incoming first years and three upper-class students to the program, and every scholar remained admirably focused on their aspirations while managing unexpected hurdles connected to the coronavirus pandemic and beyond. Our scholars have relished the unique task of rebuilding their UVA experiences, and their curiosity, resilience, and devotion to achieving excellence "in spite of" never ceased to amaze me.

This new normal meant returning to more in-person events in addition to hybrid activities, connecting scholars with our board and each other. In honor of our four graduating scholars, we hosted our first ever Ridley Scholar Send-Off. Prior to walking the Lawn, we celebrated the achievements of Isaiah Jenkins. Takara Washington, Garvey Cummings and Andrea Parrish with their families in late April. Graduating scholars received a \$500 Annetta Thompson Award, a ceremonial Jefferson Cup and a graduation stole to commemorate their achievement. This event also highlighted the inception of our Ridley Scholar Oath, which was administered to the graduating class during the celebration.

We held an in-person Scholar Selection Weekend for the first time in two years, with a host of students from across the Commonwealth and the U.S. visiting Grounds to explore both UVA and Ridley. This fall, we will welcome six new first-year scholars to Grounds selected from a highly competitive pool of students.

Thank you for everything you have done to support Ridley over the last 35 years. Serving this monumental program at such a critical juncture in its history has been meaningful and fulfilling, and it is our hope that the stories of our current scholars and Ridley alumni inspire you as you reflect on your impact.


**Garvey Cummings** Holland-Blackburn Scholar Maynard, MA




Isaiah Jenkins Ridley Flagship Scholar Danville, VA

Takara Washington **Hoel-Perkins Scholar** Gordonsville, VA




### Letter from the 2021-22 Treasurer
